Best Kept Secret In Memphis



The design of the three story hotel, with rooms on both sides of the street, more resembles a European village or the small luxury hotels of New Orleans such as the St.

Marie and Royal Sonesta.

A unique feature is a small library nestled in the corner just as you exit the elevator on each floor. Two large comfortable chairs are quite inviting with a hot pot of coffee awaiting guests as well.

As soon as we opened the door to our room, we quickly noticed the beautiful view of the Mississippi River. A fresh bouquet of flowers for Lisa and a plate of chocolate covered strawberries made us feel quite at home.

The service throughout the hotel was impeccable, which continued into the fine dining restaurant Currents. Lisa and I both had grilled salmon, which I remarked was the best cookedpiece of fish I believe I've ever eaten.

If The River Inn needed anymore selling points, it would be that it is a mere five minute drive to Downtown Memphis and the Orpheum, FedEx Forum, Beale Street, The Rendezvous, Auto Zone Park and Peabody Place.
